






We believe that government should serve the people, and that 'the state', so often derided, is simply the way that citizens work together to enhance the public good.

We believe that government should be:

- Open, transparent and accountable, with no hiding place for backroom influence.
- Rational, with decisions and policy based on sound evidence, not media pressure.
- Courageous, able to make difficult decisions without pandering to short-termism.
- Ethical: dedicated to creating a sustainable society and economy with progressive moral values.
- Bottom-up: People should be telling the government what they want from a local level, rather than being told from the top.

We believe that individuals should be:

- Free to act in any manner that does not harm another individual, and does not infringe upon the rights of other individuals.
- Enjoy a fundamental right to privacy from the state or their agents.

In short, we wish to ensure government remains open and transparent, whilst individuals retain liberty and privacy.

We believe that we are heading towards a better future, and that government has an essential role in taking us there. We also believe that as a country, we can self-govern better in the future, and will create policy that hopes to re-engage citizens in our democratic process.

In the case one is called, members should be elected on a non-partisan ticket under a proportional electoral system, and it should have free power to make amendments to the constitution.






Voting is done using special symbols in the comments for a change:


Contributors (41)

Contributors have had a proposal accepted, and thus under the rules, get voting rights on future proposals.





Other participants have either submitted a (so far) unsuccessful proposal, or just taken part in the discussion, and do not yet have voting rights.



- Anything can be changed.
- All contributions and discussions should be public, ideally on GitHub.
- Plain English is essential follow the GDS style guide if you can, or use Hemingway to test readability.
 Try to avoid political weasel-words.
- Make changes small, self-contained, and simple. Large changes will take a lot longer to get agreed upon and merged. Small is agile.
- Changes need not be fully detailed or final. In fact, accepting partial improvements which we then build upon is encouraged, as it keeps things moving faster.
